









What are Read Aloud Books?

Good **read alouds** are books that you can sink your teeth into! They are full of **new words, new ideas, different cultures, exciting storylines, interesting characters, and beautiful illustrations**. Talk about all of these things with your children while you are reading so that they learn “new words”. Time passes quickly with these books because they are filled with knowledge, and knowledge brings pleasure!

Be sure to read **Fables** (i.e.: The Hare and the Tortoise, Town Mouse and Country Mouse, The Boy who Cried Wolf), **Folk Tales** (The Gingerbread Man, Goldilocks & the 3 Bears, Little Red Riding Hood, etc.) and **Fairy Tales** (Jack and the Beanstalk, The Princess and the Pea, The Emperor’s New Clothes, The Little Match Girl, etc.).
